Please help WRPC with a contribution to address water pollution at the Flambeau Mine

Despite the ongoing pollution of the Flambeau River from the closed Flambeau Mine at Ladysmith, WI, the owner of the mine, Kennecott Minerals, has been promoting the mine in Michigan's Upper Peninsula and Aitkin County, MN as an example of how mining can be done in an environmentally responsible fashion. Poly Met, a Canadian mining company, has been doing the same in promoting its NorthMet sulfide mining project at Hoyt Lakes in northeastern Minnesota, and so has Aquila Resources when promoting its "Back Forty Project" in Menominee County, MI. In all of these places there is significant public opposition to new metallic sulfide mining.

The Flambeau Mine has also been cited by Tamerlane Ventures, a Canadian-based mining company that is trying to resurrect the Lynne mine project in Wisconsin's Oneida County. At a recent county board meeting, Tamerlane's president and CEO, Ross F. Burns, told WRPC's treasurer, Karl Fate, that the Lynne site, which is part of the Ladysmith-Rhinelander-Crandon Greenstone Belt, is comparable to the mineral-rich Timmons mining district in Ontario, Canada.

On June 18, 2009, WRPC put both Kennecott and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) on notice that the truth about the Flambeau mine is going to be brought out in a lawsuit over water pollution caused by the partially reclaimed mine. Thanks to WRPC member Laura Furtman's careful collection of the company's own monitoring data, and with the help of three scientists (Dr. David Chambers, Dr. Kendra Zamzow and Dr. Ken Parejko), plus WRPC attorney Glenn Stoddard of Eau Claire, we have given Kennecott and the DNR 30 days to address the continuing pollution of groundwater and the Flambeau River from the mine site.

Copies of WRPC's Notice of Complaint, along with the scientific reports from our consultants and summaries of all the relevant documents are posted on the WRPC website: <u>www.wrpc.net</u> We urge our members to visit the website and then write letters to the editor of your local paper responding to Kennecott's claim that these concerns have already been addressed "with facts and science." If you read our scientific reports accompanying our lawsuit, you will see that Kennecott's monitoring is inadequate.

This lawsuit will have major consequences that extend far beyond the Flambeau River. WPRC is bound and determined to see this through to the end and, rest assured, we are in no mood to compromise with those who would despoil our landscapes, destroy our clean water and change our way of life.
